2	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, good morning,
3	all. This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone
4	signed up for public comment?
5	MR. TROBMAN: Good morning, Commissioners.
6	No, we do not have [inaudible] registered for public comment
7	this morning.
8	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, thank you.
9	Good morning, Ms. Miller.
10	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. This brings
11	us to the end of Agenda Items 3 through 7. Let's pause for a
12	few minutes to reset for the rest of the meeting.
13	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, we're back.
14	On Agenda Item 8, staff does not have anything to present for
15	this item. Agenda Item 9, discussion, consideration, and
16	possible action regarding publication for public comment of
17	proposed amendments to 40 TAC chapter 803, skills development
18	fund. This item is being postponed to a future meeting so we
19	can have a full discussion of our proposed edits to the rules.
20	COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, have we
21	confirmed on a date for that meeting?
22	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's my understanding we

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's my understanding we have, but I don't know what that is. We were working that out with the general counsel's office.

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COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Okay. Perfect, thank you, sir.

Agenda Item 10, statewide initiatives, although I'm told staff does not have anything to present for this item. On item 11, discussion, consideration, and possible action regarding guidance on resource utilization and implementation of services and strategies to target disaster relief efforts and public health emergencies, including those funded with the Department of Labor's disaster dislocated worker grant. And I think we have a discussion [sounds like] paper on this item.

MR. SERNA: Yes, sir, and Travis Weaver's gonna lay that out.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you.

TRAVIS WEAVER: Thank you. Good morning, Chairman Daniel, Commissioners, Mr. Serna. For the record, Travis Weaver, workforce development division. On April 16, 2020, the Department of Labor awarded \$12 million in disaster dislocated worker grant funds to expedite disaster relief services in Texas. And on September 29, TWC received an additional \$27,685,179, for a total of \$39,685,179 to serve a minimum of 2,042 Texans. Of the 28 workforce development boards, 16 have been participating in this disaster dislocated worker grant to serve individuals and communities impacted by this pandemic. Disaster dislocated worker grants are

supplemental resources that provide [inaudible] in responding and recovering from disasters, and DOL expects these grants to be aligned with existing state and local priorities, resources, and programs. Disaster dislocated worker grants provide disaster relief and humanitarian assistance employment as well as career and training services and support services, as appropriate to minimize the employment and economic impact of declared disasters in emergency situations and disaster-declared areas. Participants served and original funding amounts have been adjusted [inaudible] to reflect the additional funding from DOL in the chart below. Today, staff seeks approval from the commission on the use of the additional \$27,685,179, for a total of \$39,685,179 to serve a minimum of 2,042 Texans through the disaster dislocated worker grants, with 16 boards. Commissioners, this concludes my comments. I'm happy to answer 16 any questions. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions? COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I have one question for Mr. Weaver. Mr. Weaver, can high school kids be eligible for this funding? TRAVIS WEAVER: We are actually working with DOL on that question. We have provided that answer, and Commissioner, let me get back to you in your offices on that. COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: I'd appreciate that, 25 thank you.

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regarding approval of the local workforce development board nominees.

SHUNTA WILLIAMS: Good morning, Chairman Daniel, Commissioner Alvarez, Commissioner Demerson, and Mr. Serna.

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Good morning.

SHUNTA WILLIAMS: For the record, Shunta Williams with the workforce development division. And before you for consideration we have workforce board nominees for Workforce Solutions for North Central Texas, Golden Crescent, Middle Rio Grande, Permian Basin, Rural Capital Area, and Texhoma. This concludes my request, and I'm here to answer any questions you may have.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions?

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I do have comments. Regarding the nominees for the Middle Rio Grande, I would like to start off by thanking both nominees for their interest in serving as board members. Both nominees represent entities that do not have any active employees. While this may be a worthwhile perspective within a board, this board already has similarly situated members to provide such a perspective. In general, it would be my preference to see private sector representatives actively engaged in supervision, hiring, firing, promoting, and other managing employees within the workforce area. This board is already well above the minimum board member

1 size, so minimum board size is not a concern here. We should 2 not at this time approve the nominees for Middle Rio Grande. 3 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Additional comments or 4 questions? 5 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Based on what I'm 6 hearing, it's [inaudible] the private sector individuals, and so 7 I'd like to take a look at what Commissioner Alvarez has raised. 8 It's coming forth from the board and so I respect what they're 9 putting forward, but I wanna go ahead and take a look at this, 10 and then take action on it as fast as possible after 11 [inaudible]. So if it comes back up next week, then we'll get 12 that [inaudible] about those private sector individuals. Again, 13 respecting the board's submission of those names, it's something 14 that I respect, but based on the comments [inaudible] look into 15 that, especially from the private sector standpoint. 16 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is anybody in any danger 17 of a compliance issue if we just delay consideration of this 18 entire item to next week? 19 SHUNTA WILLIAMS: No, sir. 20 MR. SERNA: No, sir, I don't believe that 21 we are. Shunta? 22 SHUNTA WILLIAMS: I'm sorry--no, sir. 23 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Commissioners, would you agree to delay consideration of this item for one week, so that 24 25 everyone can do their proper due diligence?

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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Okay.

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   We'll pick this back up next week.
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                         COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Okay.
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                         COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Thank you, Chairman.
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   And we did check with staff to make sure that they would not be-
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   -that this would not hurt them at a future board meeting. So,
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   thank you for that.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: No, thank you. Let's
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   see--that was item 12. Was [inaudible]--
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                         COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: That's correct, sir.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Yeah, item 13, there's
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   not a legislative report today. Ed, do we have an executive
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   director's report today?
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                         MR. SERNA: I don't have anything to report
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   this morning, sir.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Are there any other--
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                         COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I'm sorry,
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   but could I go back on item 12? Could we approve the other
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   board nominees, with the exception of Middle Rio at this time?
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Well, I asked if anybody
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   was in any kind of jeopardy for compliance issues, and the
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   answer was no.
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                         COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: I know for the
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   Middle Rio Grande was the only board that I checked to see if we
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   were in compliance. I didn't check with the others.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Yeah, Ms. Williams
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   confirmed that there was no issues if we just delayed the whole
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   item [inaudible].
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                         SHUNTA WILLIAMS: [inaudible] correct.
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                         COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Okay.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's probably more
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   orderly [inaudible] Commissioner.
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                         COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Agree.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Okay. Any other order of
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   business to come before the commission?
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                         COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: None here, Chairman.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: [Inaudible] Do we have a
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   motion to adjourn?
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                         COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: I move that we
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   adjourn, Chairman.
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COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: I second the
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   motion.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: I could get behind that,
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   so we're unanimous [inaudible].
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                         COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: All right.
                        CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thanks, guys. Y'all have
