CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, the work
session (inaudible) force discussion, consideration, and
possible action regarding the 2020 Texas Workforce Commission
annual report to the governor and the legislature pursuant to
Texas Labor Code section 301.065. Let me open just by saying
thank you to staff for the work they've put into the document,
and our efforts going forward to get this refined and published.
I think we definitely wanna do this before the end of the year,
if not sooner, and so depending on what happens today in the
work session, you know, it may be a little bit of a fast track
to get any final edits done and get it moving. But I think we
have a good starting point, based on (inaudible) staff has done,
and I think we've gotten an opportunity to do that. You know, I
think this work session will be fairly important for us to just
tackle this issue as a single-issue item, and really understand
what we need to see for that. I have a couple of edits that I'm
gonna introduce. I'll introduce it as (sounds like) total
section edits. It's just a re-write of a couple of sections.
In fact, why don't I ask staff to distribute that information
now, so that my fellow commissioners can take a look at that.
Are you there?

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: We've got them,

excellent, excellent. So what I've done is I've done a re-write to the message from the commissioners. It is very brief. intended for it to be. I just wanna set up the rest of the report. That is certainly open for discussion. That's my opinion, and you'll see my thoughts there. And then I made some edits also to the staff's COVID section. I emphasized, I think, some different things than staff did in terms of our ability to serve Texans during this time, and some things that we learned along the way. It's just a -- the facts are the same. the presentation is a little bit different. And then I've introduced a third component, which we did not discuss in our outline that we talked about back in late October. This report is--we do a lot of stuff, as reflected by this report, and I think the thing that didn't get captured in the program-byprogram description, which I do think is important, is the way those are interlinked and the way they work together to develop and deliver programs to Texans. And so the third component of my edits would be a -- it essentially would serve as an executive summary, and it highlights some specific items. I'm quite sure I probably didn't get all the items that needed to be highlighted in there, and so I think that's definitely open for discussion. It's just a new element, and so I needed to bring that to your attention, that I think between the COVID section and the rest of the report, I just think we need something that

1 helps tie it all together. Those are the things that I've 2 proposed for consideration, and then certainly I definitely 3 wanna hear from you on where we might stand with things you'd 4 like to see and how you wanna proceed. 5 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: I'll defer to 6 Commissioner Demerson first. 7 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: (sounds like) As 8 your right to do so. 9 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: I wanna hear what 10 you have to say, buddy. 11 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: So basically, 12 Chairman, the commissioners' message that we received in the 13 draft, this has taken the place of the commissioners' message 14 that we had received in prior packages. 15 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: That would be my intent, 16 yeah. 17 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Okay. All right, 18 and then (inaudible) do this real quick. My quick read on this, 19 I looked at the items that were added, I'm fine with the 20 (inaudible) section in here on page 6 of the draft, where it 21 talks about maybe the last sentence on there, with the 22 quidebook. So I'll go ahead and read this, you guys, on page 6, 23 the first para up there. And I'll start at, you know, address, 24 employer info at TWC.state.tx to assist employers with questions 25 about employment law and (inaudible) me I want point this out,

at (inaudible) at the word "the," formerly Texas Business Today publication, as well as the—and it's the Especially for Texas Employers Guidebook. We've renamed the Texas guidebook for employers, as well as the Especially for Texas Employers Guidebook. Other than that, I'm fine with this message. I think (inaudible) on the surface seem to be things that will bring even more attention to what the agency's doing and really highlight some of the efforts that we have out there. So those are my comments. You got it.

1 page 8, if I could just put maybe our 1-800 number, maybe our 2 email address to UI claimants that may have some questions. You 3 know, it's very simple. The other thing is I was wondering, on 4 page that Commissioner Demerson referenced where we talk about 5 the various grant opportunities that we have, Chairman, I've 6 noticed that in all the reports that we have, and I spoke to 7 Mary York about this yesterday, we do not indicate self-8 sufficiency. So I understand that that's a different program, 9 but it's still a grant process, and it's part of our blended 10 services. So I was wondering if it was okay that in that 11 section where we talk about (sounds like) TIP and some of the 12 other programs that we have, if it's an opportunity for us to 13 include self-sufficiency as well. 14 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: I believe that would be 15 appropriate. 16 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Yeah (inaudible) --17 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: But other than that-18 19 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: (Inaudible) 20 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Other than that, 21 like I said, your changes and what you've done here by 22 shortening it certainly is--by what I've seen, we like it. 23 we can make any other changes. Like I said, I would just like to put our labor information on my section, what my website is, 24

We need to get self-sufficiency added in there as an edit. I think that's a great edit. If that works and that doesn't pose any kind of impediment, that might be best for us to just be double sure
